PIECES from the Children's Program!

April is Autism Awareness month and GSDC would like to thank all of the parents and providers for working and cooperating with us over the many years we have been providing services. We have enjoyed getting to know every participant who has Autism because each has such a unique personality and watching them succeed and discover who they are or what they like is rewarding and motivating to keep helping them succeed. Going the extra mile is something that GSDC strives toward because each voice deserves to be heard by someone and the more advocates the more success and independence we see. This can be anything from communicating with parents or providers, having them volunteer and be apart of the community, attending and incorporating outside services like occupational therapy, physical therapy, or school services.

The children's program has changed over the past year and so have the activities that we have been doing with the children at the center and in the community. We encourage them to participate and socialize with peers while providing opportunities for them to expand their interests or include their own interests. We also have sensory outlets and activities that meet some of the needs that children with autism have. We put together different sensory bins like; beans, rice, bird seed, flour, water beads, and sand. In the bins there are items of different textures and colors, and tools to dig and play with. We also have weight bags that they can use on their laps or shoulders. With the warm weather moving in we have been going to the all abilities west park where they have different sensory equipment for them to access. We are very excited about this year's summer program and are expecting the kids to make a lot of progress with each piece of the puzzle!
